Executive Summary

On the KARMA website, a feature to report karst springs, caves or karst groundwater dependent ecosystems (KGDE) was implemented, in order to capture karst features that are not yet in the KARMA database. Some basic information (coordinates, photo, estimated discharge for springs, lengths of caves, description of a KGDE) will be requested. The project administration is doing a plausibility check and decides, whether the feature is relevant or not and if further processing is appropriate. Via the website, the respondent can contact the project administration using an email form, or a google online form, which allows more specific input.




